



The mission of A Night Without A Bed event is to provide an opportunity for Monmouth County youth to learn about the plight of families and children who are experiencing homelessness every night.

We also **raises essential funds to support program operations** such as: food, clothing, emergency shelter, comprehensive case management, transportation, life skills training and prevention/stabilization for our families.

Participants are asked to sleep in a box for one night in addition to raising pledges for the cause, **at least \$150** towards our goal.
