Thoughts after 1-25-26 Faith Leaders CALL TO ACTION

A Reflection following a national Call to ACTION Webinar

January 26, 2026

On Sunday, Jan. 25, 2026, people of faith, including thousands of spiritual leaders from many traditions, joined together for a web-based gathering to pray. Faith in Action, a broad coalition of organizations and activists working for social transformation, provided the platform for leaders to lead web attenders in prayer and reflection and community.

I was one of those in attendance along with several other members of our church and many leaders from our Association and Conference, joining in the lament for the violent suffering happening in Minneapolis, as well as across the county. There were many moving and meaningful moments, including Bishop Mariann Budde, and our own UCC General Minister, the Rev. Karen Georgia Thompson who urged "it's time to return peace to our nations' cities." (You can learn more by clicking [here](#).)

Here are some things I've continued to ponder:
The need to be in prayer together with others who are finding ways to respond with loving, non-violent action overwhelms my soul right now. We need each other; we need to find encouragement and resolve and renewal with other siblings and friends. Prayer takes so many different forms and at this very moment, includes the determination again and again to renounce violence even when this is the choice of the most powerful leaders in this nation right now.

FROM THE PASTOR (continued)

Our example is surely the humility and integrity with which Jesus stood before power without becoming violent.

The call to the activities of peace-making is a daily challenge for so many; for me this means giving a continuing clear, patient but persistent voice to the deep-seated message of Jesus' call to discipleship: "Follow me..." "You are the salt of the earth.." "...let your light shine before others." "Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me..." "Love your neighbor..." (Matthew chaps 5-7, 11, 22)

A recent blog for faith leaders shared a re-run of an interview they shared with Lean Gunning Frances who is an academic dean, professor, activist and organizer and author. She was talking about her book on Ferguson - the murder of Michael Brown in August, 2014, which reawakened the organized protests for civil rights in this country - and made these comments:

We need to call out the leader within and to look for opportunities to engage in transformative acts for justice right where we are and to align ourselves with other people that are seeking to do this kind of work. None of us will ever measure up, so let's not even set that model as a goal. Instead, let's ... embody the spirit that calls us to look for the leader within, that calls us to reach out to others to join together, to form coalitions, to make change right where we are.

"We need to call out the leader within" has been ringing in my ears ever since. The Jan. 25th web gathering mandate is to push forward, to keep on organizing and bearing witness in peace; to show up and speak up and expect the change we want to see will mean new levels of participation and even sacrifice. What does your "leader within" sound like? What does this moment evoke for you as you commit yourself to the way of Jesus?

People of faith throughout our nation were encouraged to gather in Washington D.C. on Thursday, the 29th to call on our Senators to deny funding for continuing violent federal forces including ICE. Remember to call all your legislators and ask for their support. Count me in. #persist, #nomorehate, #notnormal



National Faith Call to Action -- Sunday, January 25

More than 12,000 people, including quite a few of us from Holmdel UCC, participated in a zoom call sponsored by Faith in Action in Washington, DC. Again, the focus was a call to stand with each other and urge the Senate to vote NO on the upcoming Appropriations Bill which would provide funding for DHS. They also called for a Congressional investigation into the role of ICE in local communities. A protest is planned for Thursday, January 29 at the Capital where the Appropriations Bill will be deliberated and voted on. We will be following the activities in the Senate closely.



MOCA (Monmouth Ocean County Action)

MOCA will be meeting on Monday, February 9 at the Holmdel Public Library at Bell Works from 9:30-11:30 AM. The focus will be on curbing the activities of ICE locally. We will be making "Know Your Rights" whistle bags and forming teams to act on the Visibility Brigade's Operation Fortify. This initiative aims to help local businesses protect employees who may be targeted by ICE.
